

Part IV - Narrative description of Your Activities

The Palmyra-Eagle Community Band (PECB) was formed in 1993 by "Band Manager" Alice Ventura. There were four (4) musicians present at the first rehearsal. The first concert was presented on June 14, 1993, Flag Day, in the Palmyra Village Park. Through the years, membership has grown to 30 plus members. Members are of all ages and generally residents of the Villages of Palmyra and Eagle area. Band membership is all volunteer, with no auditions, open to anyone who wants to play and learn music and perform in public concerts. The band is supported financially by free-will contributions from local businesses, civic groups, private persons and the band members themselves. From time to time PECB will perform concerts at venues for which it will receive a monetary donation. All concerts are "Free Admission."

A typical concert season starts with weekly rehearsals beginning in late January or early February. These rehearsals are held on Monday evenings, usually at Palmyra-Eagle High School's band room or the Palmyra-Eagle Grade School, when High School activities take precedence. (The School District does not charge local organizations for use of facilities, thus there is no charge to the PECB for use of the band rooms.) Rehearsals begin at 7:00 pm and conclude around 8:30 pm. PECB's first performance of the season is usually providing music for a community Lenten Service held at the Palmyra United Methodist Church on a Wednesday in March. Each May and October the band performs a concert for the residents of the Fairhaven Retirement Community in Whitewater, WI. Summer concerts begin in June and continue through August or September. The band presents two (2) "Park Concerts" in each community of Palmyra and Eagle. PECB typically performs a concert at the "Fathers' Day Fly-In" at Palmyra's airport and also for the Eagle Historical Society's "Ice Cream Social" in the Eagle Village Park. From time to time, PECB is invited to perform concerts for the residents of the Countryside Home in Jefferson WI. A concert is also performed at the "Family Farm Festival" held in September as a fund raiser for the Palmyra-Eagle Scholarship and Education Foundation. The season concludes with two (2) holiday concerts in December, one in each Village.

An initial "Board of Directors" was formed voluntarily at the request of Band Manager, Alice Ventura, to assist with the ongoing operations of the band. In 2007, this Board decided that the PECB should become incorporated as a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation. "By-Laws" and "Articles of Incorporation" were developed and ratified by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the band membership on May 21, 2007, thus becoming Palmyra-Eagle Community Band, Inc. Tax-except status is also being pursued.

As included in its mission statement, the PECB seeks to offer amateur musicians the opportunity to perform in a concert band and to support education in concert band music. To this end, in the future, the Board has discussed providing scholarships/grants to young musicians to help further music education and providing community service recognition points to high school students who participate/perform with PECB. Also, there has been discussion about performing concerts at area grade schools to familiarize young people with concert band music and the band instruments.

PECB Board Minutes 11-13-07

The Holiday concerts will be held December 2 and 3. Barb obtained the okay to use the Methodist Church for December 2 and Alice, Eagle Elementary School for December 3.
