A Fourth for the ages

Eagle — Ed Pierce always gets goose bumps

when he hears the melody.

Written in the 1850s with a different title and words than those most Americans now know, "Battle Hymn of the Republic" is Pierce's favorite patriotic song. As leader of the brass band that occasionally plays at Old World Wisconsin, Pierce gets to hear the tune quite often.

"I don't know anybody who could not be moved by 'Battle Hymn of the Republic,' "Pierce said Friday during the living history site's Fourth of July celebration. "When you play 'Battle Hymn' you move audiences. People hear it and immediately recognize it as the freedom song."

While many communities observe the day the Continental Congress adopted its Declaration of Independence from England with fireworks, picnics and parades, the celebration at Old World Wisconsin harkened back to the late 19th and early 20th centuries, when Americans observed the Fourth of July a bit differently.

So visitors spent the day listening to a concert of patriotic music that dated from the 1800s — complete with authentic instruments and music scores

There were also groups who would have proudly narched in July Fourth arades a century or more go, such as the Women's thristian Temperance inion ladies holding a Cold Water Army" baner, and suffragettes in urple sashes and big hats.

In the days before there ere bottle rockets and nells that looked like giant aming chrysanthemums, lere were anvil firings.

"Everyone would have ngregated at the black-nith shop on the Fourth. nis would have been the reworks of its day," said ohn Meyer, a blacksmith Old World Wisconsin nce 2001.

Meyer lighted a long fuse at snaked up to two 165pund anvils stacked on p of each other with half pound of gunpowder in stween.

As children and adults ugged ears with fingers, ie gunpowder erupted in ame and a loud boom as ie of the anvils shot up ito the air and came back earth just as quickly. Ist like at a fireworks splay, the crowd oohed id cheered.




