

# **Select Program Notes**

# The Great Race:

Henry Mancini composed The Great Race March for this 1965 Blake Edwards movie about a cross-country auto race, starring Jack Lemmon, Tony Curtis, and Natalie Wood. At the time it was the most expensive comedy film ever created, costing over 12-million dollars (for comparison Disney's 'Tangled' was 260-million!). " *The Great Race* was generally not well-received upon release and w as considered a critical flop, making it the first notable failure for director Edwards. Most critics attacked its blatant and overdone slapstick humor and its lack of substance. It also suffered from comparisons with another race-themed "epic comedy" of 1965, "Those Magnificent Men in Their Flying Machines". The Great Race has since gained something of a cult-following, primarily for "the greatest pie fight ever", including the throwing of 4000 pies, the most pies ever thrown in a movie pie-fight (Laurel and Hardy arguably topped that by using 3000 pies in only a single day of shooting!).

# The Thunderer (Sousa):

The famous 1889 march of John Philip Sousa is of mysterious origin, although it is speculated that it gets its name from the "pyrotechnic [effects] of the drum and bugle in [the] score." We play it today to hopefully invite the thunder and lightning of a genuine rainstorm soon. All Hail The Thunderer!

## Lassus Trombone + Slim Trombone:

Henry Fillmore of Cincinnati, and the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, was a prolific composer, the "father of the trombone smear," who as a youth played piano, violin, flute and guitar before developing a fascination for the slide trombone (an instrument his religious father viewed as "an instrument of Satan"). His dads view was not that uncommon in the early 20th-century when " musicians using the trombone tended to be regarded as street corner riffraff." Fillmore forsook playing semi-professional football with the forerunners of the Cincinnati Bengals, to compose music, of which Lassus Trombone and Slim Trombone are two of a series of fifteen novelty tunes called "The Trombone Family". While some of Fillmore's racial subtitles for these pieces--for example the final one, "Ham Trombone: A cullud bahbaque," bluntly display the unabashed racism of his day, his music continues to entertain audiences today.

# The Washington Post March (Sousa):

The Washington Post march is one of John Philip Sousa's most famous marches, commissioned by the Washington Post newspaper, and composed in 1889. "In the early 20th century, the polka-based dance step the "two step" became so strongly identified with Sousa's song that it was often called "The Washington Post," as in 'let's dance another Washington Post!'

# Any Bonds Today? (Berlin)

"Any Bonds Today?" is a song written by Irving Berlin featured in a 1942 animated wartime propaganda cartoon starring Bugs Bunny. Both song and cartoon encouraged audiences to support the war effort by buying government bonds and stamps during World War II. This cartoon and the Donald Duck version of Der Fuehrer's Face--also played by the Palmyra-Eagle Community Band for its wartime historical program--are readily available on Youtube.

# Palmyra-Eagle Community Band CD-Recording Project Origin

On July 10, 2011, the 30-member Palmyra-Eagle Community Band and the Eagle Historical Society presented an ice-cream social and concert that was one of the high points of our year. Almost 30 veterans of WWI made the trip to be honored publicly for their service to our nation, one even traveling in a specially-outfitted ambulance. These veterans were each photographed in front of a poster with pictures of area servicemen from WWII, and each vet present was recognized individually during the program. The band played classic WWII medleys like Sentimental Journey, Remember Pearl Harbor, Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy, and The White Cliffs of Dover, and the audience sang along to the lyrics of well-know numbers like I'll Be Seeing You and Der Fuehrers Face. Two swing dancers from Fred Astaire Dance Studio in Wales cut the rug to Chattanooga Choo Choo and Glenn Miller selections. Director Ed Pierce and Eagle Historical Society head Elaine Ledrowski narrated a war broadcast from fictional WWII radio station KEGL, with announcements-- from the attack on Pearl Harbor, to requests to buy war bonds and save stockings, to the news of V-E day in Europe.

At the end of the concert program, as the over 200 audience members were milling around talking, having last helpings of ice cream and root beer, and expressing their gratitude to the veterans present, band director Ed Pierce and more than one band member heard comments from listeners like: 'You've outdone yourself with this concert!', 'Do you have a CD of your music?', 'When are you going to make a CD?'. That hot day in Eagle Park in July set the band to thinking. Since our audiences keep asking, why don't we try recording a CD!

In 2012, we decided to make that dream a reality, and start our CD-project "The 40s: A Sentimental Journey"

# **CD PREVIEW**

God Bless America (Irving Berlin) was practically the theme song of Kate Smith, who also was known for The White Cliffs of Dover (below). Her God Bless America became well-known across the country in 1939 and has remained famous for decades (returning to sports events after 9/11/2001). After the Philadelphia Flyers hockey team began in 1969 to play her rendition of "God Bless America" before games, their won/loss record when "God Bless America" is played or sung in person stands at a remarkable 94 wins, 26 losses, and 4 ties as of April 26, 2011. Smith and her song remain a special part of Flyers' history. In 1987, the team erected a statue of Smith outside their arena, the Spectrum, in memory of this performing dynamo who said of herself 'It ain't BEGUN until the fat lady sings!' . Tonight director Ed Pierce will introduce a special treat for you--our own "Kate Smith" for the night!

Remember Pearl Harbor (Reid & Kaye, arr. Yoder). 10 days after the Pearl Harbor attack on December 7, 1941, Don Reid and Sammy Kaye recorded this classic WWII patriotic song based on the popular war cry, and it became an instant hit with the public. "Its immediate popularity spawned a wealth of militant,--occasionally semi-racist--anthems such as 'We did it before and we'll do it again', 'Goodbye Mama, I'm off to Yokohama', 'The Son-of-a-Gun who picks on Uncle Same', 'Let's Put the Axe to the Axis', and 'Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition' (http://library.umkc.edu/spec-col/ww2/pearlharbor)

I'll Be Seeing You (Kahal & Fain, arr. Yoder). Featured throughout the 1944 movie starring Ginger Rogers and Joseph Cotten of the same name, 'I'll be Seeing You' became a hit recording by Bing Crosby that year. Later, the song became notably associated with Liberace, as the theme music to his television show of the 1950s. It has been recorded and performed by numerous artists including Frank Sinatra, Rosemary Clooney, Ray Conniff, Cass Elliot, Billie Holiday, Linda Ronstadt, Rod Stewart, and many others. More recently, Jimmy Durante's 1960s version was used in the 2004 movie 'The Notebook'.

Praise the Lord & Pass The Ammunition describes a chaplain ("sky pilot") being with some fighting men who are under attack from an enemy. He is asked to say a prayer for the men who were engaged in firing at the oncoming planes. The chaplain puts down his Bible, mans one of the ship's gun turrets and begins firing back, saying, "Praise the Lord and pass the ammunition". The real story was told by Chaplain Howell Forgy on the game show 'I've Got a Secret' in 1955: "Well, I was stationed aboard the USS New Orleans, and we were tied up at 1010 dock in Pearl Harbor when we attacked again. We were having a turbine lifted, and all of our electrical power wasn't on, and so when we went to lift the ammunition by the hoist, we had to form lines of men — form a bucket brigade — and we began to carry the ammunition up through the quarterdeck into the gurneys, and I stood there and directed some of the boys down the port side and some down the starboard side, and as they were getting a little tired, I just happened to say, "Praise the Lord and pass the ammunition." That's all there was to it.

The White Cliffs of Dover (Kent & Burton, arr. Briegel). "(There'll Be Bluebirds Over) The White Cliffs of Dover" is a popular World War II song made famous by Vera Lynn with her 1942 recording - one of her best known recordings. Written in 1941 by Walter Kent and Nat Burton, the song was also among the most popular Second World War tunes. It was written before America had joined World War II, to uplift the spirits of the Allies at a time when Nazi Germany had conquered much of Europe's area and was bombing Britain. The song was written at a time when British and German aircraft had been fighting over the cliffs of Dover in the Battle of Britain: the song's lyrics looked toward a time when the war would be over and peace would rule over the iconic White Cliffs of Dover, Britain's de facto border with the European mainland. (ref. wikipedia). Ironically, there are no bluebirds in Great Britain; it is an American bird; the bluebird is simply a symbol of peace.

# **RECORDING HINTS**

Any noise you make, foot tapping, coughing, hitting your music stand, EVEN WHISPERING can ruin a take. What is damaging is not realizing you have done so, only to discover after both sessions are over.

PLEASE exercise extreme caution: be very aware of your physical movements! Pulling slides to dump water should be only done IN BETWEEN TAKES! Wait to empty water! Even moving your music can make significant noise.

TURN OFF ALL ELECTRONICS! Pagers, cell phones, beepers, watch alarms, etc.

A recording session is not at all like a concert. Tapping a music stand, foot noise, anything can loose a take. There are some in the band who have been through this with other groups and know the results from bitter experience.

At the end of a take, FREEZE! Keep you instrument up for about five seconds. Each take needs "dead time" at the end. A sudden noise can cost even the most wonderful take.

PLEASE BE EARLY! Arrive no later than 9:30 on Saturday and Sunday no later than 1:30.






